GB Vets Tour to Antibes

What started as a small 5 man team of Kent GB Vets players ended up as a 10 man team, which included a number of England and World ranked players from... well, north of Watford.

Most had braved the Easyjet flights down to Nice airport on the Friday in readiness for a practice session at the Antibes Squash and Fitness Centre in the early evening. This was much needed since the courts appeared a lot faster off the front wall and it took a while to adjust to the ball coming off the back wall due to the dark carpet

The main matches took place on the Saturday. We could see before we started that we could have quite a fight on our hands since the opposition didn't appear to

possess any grey hairs! We worked out that our average age was 63 whilst theirs was around half that!

There were some very close and also some rather one sided matches, the latter unfortunately in Antibes' favour.

The highlights started with our No.1, Steve Rudd doing battle with the Club coach, Guillaume, Steve eventually succumbing 1/3. Dave Leach (No.2) and Geoff Howes (No.5) both had hard games and notched up wins for the GB Vets, 3/2 and 3/1 respectively.

Barry Skelding (No.6) and Nigel Belle (No.7) had great 5 setters but both just lost in the fifth.

Pearse (No.3) who was up against the French O50's No.1. The result was not certain until the very last point which Martin won 10/9 in the fifth. At that point entente cordiale went out of the window with the defeated Frenchman throwing his racket all over the place and storming off court – not a pretty sight!

Messrs. Adrian Wright (No. 4), Chas Stevens (No.8), Derek Tullett (No.9) and Ray Rook (No.10) all succumbed to rather young, fit Frenchman so that the overall match result was a win for the French 7-3.

Many of the GB Vets ladies – Julie (Leach), Chris (Howes), Carol (Stevens) and Gloria (Saunders) - took to the courts and played many games of squash and racketball.

Saturday evening saw some 20 of us players, wives, partners - descend on an excellent restaurant in Juan Les Pins. The wine flowed freely and soon our battered bodies and morale were back to normal.

Squash on the Sunday consisted of doubles matches – 7 pairs, one game per match up to 15, therefore 6 games in all for everyone – exhausting fun!

The Antibes Squash Club, run by Clive and Debbie Stokes, put on an excellent buffet supper in the evening. Nigel Belle for the GB Vets thanked them both for a very well organised, thoroughly enjoyable weekend and presented Debbie with a plaque and an Anniversary Book signed by all the players.

Our thanks also went to Derek and Jonathan Tullett for organising and liaising with the Antibes Club.

We all said our good byes and disappeared into the relatively (by England standards) The real nail biting game was Martin warm night – a great weekend had by all.


Return to Mill Lane. Mill Lane Close is 1st Right

BIRMINGHAM GRAND PRIX

6-9 September 2007

Men's O50's Saw a major upset with Peter Alexander losing to his travelling partner David Taylor. In the other half Duleep Adhihetty beat long time opponent Mark Cowley.

Men's O55's With the absence of **Keith Jones** through injury, **Phil Ayton** was too good for everyone and took another title.

Men's O60's Barry Featherstone recorded his first Regional title having beaten John Smith and Chris Ansell, both 3/0, on the way.

Men's O65's Adrian Wright's proud record disappeared when he succumbed 2/3 to **Mo Khalifa** who then went on to beat the flying Yorkshireman, the world's keenest squash player **Mike Clemson**.

Men's O70's Lance Kinder lost to Pat Kirton in the extra venerables.

Women's O50's Saw a visitor from Oz, Jan Miller, win over Carolyn Roylance, who earlier took out **Karen Hume**. **Bett Dryhurst** lost to Elke Rubsam in the ½'s.

THE BRITISH OPEN 2007

Manchester - 18-24 September 2007

Men's O45's Ian Bradburn succumbed to the eventual winner Phil Whitlock in the 3rd round whilst in the bottom half of the draw **Mark Woodliffe** progressed relatively easily to the final but after a tight opening game lost 3/0.

Men's O50's The seedings went as planned to the 1/4's then Duleep Adhihetty took out the number 2 seed to meet Peter Alexander, who hadn't until then dropped a game the whole tournament, in the final. Peter triumphed 9/7 in the 4th.

Men's O55's Not many GB Vets in this age group; Howard Cherlin the only one making it to the last 8, who lost to the eventual winner Ian Parke.

Men's O60's Plenty of GB Vets in this age group! Alastair McMeckan lost to Martin Pearse in the second round, the latter having been 0/2 and 1/5 down against Mike Taylor in the previous round but eventually pulled it round to win 9/7 in the fifth. Visually, probably the best match of the whole tournament, was the battle between Chris Ansell and Trevor Wilkinson, the latter winning through in the end 10/9 in the fifth. Phil Ayton has always been the one to beat but whichever age group he is in no one has done it yet! He beat Martin Pearse in the semi 3/1 and Trevor Wilkinson 3/0 in the final.

Men's O65's The second round saw Len Froggitt take 62 minutes to beat ex tax inspector Roy Bradley 10/8 in the fifth, whilst Chris Stahl (5/8) upset the seedings by beating Mo Khalifa (3/4) 3/0. Titanic battles from the ¼'s onwards! Len F beat, for the first time ever, the No.1 seed Adrian Wright 3/1 in the semi's and Mike Clemson (nuts about squash Clemmo!) beat Chris S by the same margin in the other semi.

The match of the whole tournament though was the final. **Mike Clemson** came back from, wait for it, 0/2 and 2/8 down to survive 5 match balls and win in the fifth against poor old **Len Froggitt**. What a match!

Men's O70's With **John Woodliffe** missing Pat Kirton (still not a GB Vet, but probably the second best masters player of all time behind **Ayton**) took the title beating old adversary **Lance Kinder** 3/0. **Malcolm Gilham** and **Tony Seare** lost to Kirton and **Kinder** respectively in the semi's.

Women's O50's Karen Hume reached the semi's only to lose to the No1 seed Jan Miller, whilst **Ann Windle** lost to the eventual winner Julie Field.

Women's O55's Yet another win for **Bett Dryhurst**, the Worcestershire player, who has probably won more titles than anyone worldwide.
