

TONY BREAKWELL. Tony was a great supporter of our Club and well known for his stamina. He was a very keen 'Fell Runner' and that meant he would not 'fade' on court. He was the Club Over 45 singles champion three times running and he played for England in all the age group Home Internationals and enjoyed many tours with our Club over the years. He will be sorely missed.

SHAUN FREEMAN. Shaun Freeman started playing his squash at Ealing and finished at Colets with many a club in between. His death from cancer after a short illness came as a great shock to all who knew him, as he was still hitting tennis balls 3 weeks before. His love of life (and of wine and beer) was legendry, always the life and soul of any gathering. Shaun was never a half empty person, always Half Full. As he would have said "Marvellous".

IAN WRIGHT. Whilst not a GB Vet Ian will have been known by many. Not only had he been Secretary of Kent Squash for more than 40 years but was also on the England Squash Council and had been the national governing body's official archivist for many years. He died of a heart attack on court, age 74, playing the game he loved.

OTTO HART. Otto was a member from 1991 until recently. Born in Holland, but for many years lived in Germany running an antiques business and more recently residing in France, where a number of players have received his generous hospitality. Always on the menu was a game of Squash!

His love and enthusiasm for squash took him to all parts of the world, last October to the World Championships in New Zealand. During the Championships, Otto celebrated his 85th birthday. He will be fondly and sadly missed by all his friends.

Political gerrymandering throughout Europe and elsewhere saw the proposal to implement PARS through the back door, so to speak, was thwarted by a concentrated effort from a number of parties. The Irish received an incredibly strong backlash from senior players who found the tournaments implementing PARS a complete waste of time with playing time cut by at least 35%. In short PARS is suitable for full time Professionals and top youngsters whose retrieving abilities far exceed the vast majority of Masters players – amongst a host of other reasons!

A STORY FROM DOWN UNDER

During the World Masters in Christchurch, Chris Wilson met up with Susan Devoy, many times decorated with squash titles and reminisced about their training sessions together. Whilst touring New Zealand, after the tournament, Chris purchased a book: 'Susan Devoy Out on Top' Author: Robyn Scott Vincent.

On reading the book he came across this little snippet: Susan said of herself:

'Speed was not my strong point. Like Freddy Flintstone I would sort of run on the spot for the first set of any match before I could work up a speed.

There was one player in particular who joined our group who used to amaze me. **Christopher Wilson, an awfully English chap**, was in the army and ultra determined. We played together reasonably often as part of my training and at first he would give me an absolute thrashing. He used to try so hard, however, that he'd go sliding across the court striving after every shot and would come off after our matches with his knees all scraped and bleeding. It became an obsession each time I played him, to see if I could go one better.'

Not the first mention in a squash player's book but the first time to be called 'an awfully English chap!' Chris is in fact a Scot and has won many titles, including the British National in 1988.

The tournament was thoroughly well organised from start to finish and enjoyed by all.
