CHAIRMAN'S REPORT 2015-16

When I first took over as your Chairman two years ago, your Committee and I set out a plan of action for the next couple of years.

You may remember that the areas mentioned opportunities to revive and extend the appeal of our club; these included attracting and recruiting new members with the accent on youth; extending the friendlies fixture list by reviving old matches and setting up new ones; arranging overseas tours; expanding the annual tournament and promoting a national drive for the neglected doubles game.

I am pleased to report that we have continued to build on the progress I reported at last year's AGM.

We have been able to sustain the increase in membership. Indeed, we have already exceeded the total number of new members in 2015 in the first three months of this year. Also, it is good to report that the majority of new members are below the age of 60.

I can also report that we have arranged five new fixtures – Escorts, Petersfield, Hurlingham, Bishop's Stortford and Oxshott. I personally remain committed to arrange friendlies with The Oxford and Cambridge Club, Sandown and St. Georges Hill.

Our popular weekend trip to York will take place in June this year, and will be run by Adrian Wright. The November 2015 Festival of Squash was, courtesy of



the RAC Woodcote Park, a great success with lots of enjoyable and competitive matches played. The Army managed to retain the trophy but were closely pursued by the GB Vets team. It is great that this has, by popular demand, now become a regular feature of the season.

I would have liked to report progress on our plan to spread the doubles game, but this has proved to be a challenge; we have now, however, been able to identify sufficient interest in the South East Region and Robert Smith will be driving an initiative on this front over the next few months.

A Chairman can only be as good as his supporting Committee. We are lucky that we have a strong and hard working Committee who continue to dedicate their time to our Club. I thank them on behalf of all our members. However, our previous Hon. Match Secretary, David Smith has resigned, and our Hon. Treasurer of eight years, David Garrett, is also standing down. I forget how many times over the last year I have urged our vounger members to come forward and serve our club, but so far, this has been of no avail. We are fortunate, however, that we have two willing volunteers to take over key aspects of our club. Nick Markham-David has joined the Committee to take over as Match Secretary, whilst my wife Di Hendry (once a professional book-keeper) has agreed to take over as our Treasurer for a short time. Whilst thanking them both enormously for their willingness to put some of their energies into securing the future of our club, I will observe (in the most respectful way!) that when they join the Committee, our average age will increase! I will continue to urge our younger members to come forward to serve our club in the future.

Your Committee is always working hard to find new blood and energy to run the GB Vets. So please volunteer if you are able to help in any way, perhaps by arranging matches, tours or, indeed, in any way you are willing to contribute to the further development of our Club.

I do believe that, despite the challenging times that squash is going through, our Club is in good heart.

The MO50, MO70 and WO50 will be played in Aberdeen 20/21 May.



OBITUARIES TONY CLAYDON



It is very sad to report that Tony Claydon died peacefully in his sleep of pancreatic cancer this February. Tony became a GB Vet in 1997 and for 20 years or so was also very involved with Civil Service Squash having spent an active and successful career in both

the Navy and Army. It was little surprise that his lifestyle would produce a squash player who could 'mix it' with the best! He has represented the Gloucestershire County Squash team in various age groups and has played in the Civil Service Representative team in numerous fixtures.

Tony was our Hon. Match Secretary from 1998/9 to 2001/2 and was always a very keen willing player who played against many Clubs including Camberley, Sandhurst, Chichester, Leeon-Solent to name but a few. He also went on many tours the latest one to York.

Tony was however more than just another great player – he was undoubtedly a great bloke. His competitive nature on court was always tempered by his acute sense of fair play, his sense of humour was always evident, he was reliable and a good friend and companion to so many.

Tony will be sadly missed but not forgotten.

DAVID VAUGHAN



Late last year, David Vaughan passed away in his 90th year...

David had been a member and loyal supporter of the Great Britain Veterans Club since 1973.

His squash career went back long enough to involve some great names form the past: He won squash blues at Oxford, playing alongside the likes of Collin Haycraft, Glyn Evans, and Lawrence Verney. At club level, he played at the RAC, Hurlingham, South Kensington (including regular battles with Leonard Rossiter), and Richmond amongst others. He was an elegant and gifted player who, amongst many of his other titles, won the original British Amateur Veteran's championship for two years.

David was also thrilled to be introduced to real tennis in the late 1970's. In no time, he mastered that game. So much so indeed, that he won World Over 60's Singles title in Australia in 1990. He claimed this was only because he was slightly less incapacitated than the rest of the field!

Throughout all of his sporting career, there was one club which he loved possibly more than any other which was the Jesters Club, of which he was a member for 65 years, sitting on its committee for most of them and serving first as Chairman and then as President until just before his death. He was the doyen of the club representing it for many years at both squash and real tennis, touring with them abroad to the States, Canada and South Africa; David also, with wife Jane, hosted many overseas Jesters' teams at their house in Fulham in their gracious and inimitable way.

Taking my cue from Robert Dolman's fine speech* at a subsequent Thanksgiving Service for David: we are sad you are no longer with us but you would not want us to be sad for long. We shall remember you, all of us in our separate ways and cherish the wonderful memories we have of you, our much-loved dear friend.
