





CHAIRMAN'S REPORT 2016-17

I am delighted to report that your club is in good heart. Our finances are stable with a strong balance sheet. We continue to make encouraging progress in both our membership numbers and our outreach to all parts of the United Kingdom. We have recently had new members join from as far afield as West Yorkshire and Plymouth! We would be delighted to have more contact with Scotland and Wales.

There was a significant rule change at the AGM in April, when the members voted overwhelmingly to reduce the eligible age for joining the GB Vets from 45 to 40 for men and 40 to 35 for ladies. This enables us to extend membership to a wider range of players who may not aspire to play at County and Masters level, but do want to continue to play in an active middle age and beyond! We have already extended the range of categories in our popular Club Tournament to include "non-County players" with great success; we will continue to widen this initiative.

We are, however, still struggling to add new friendlies to our fixture list, although we have succeeded in reenergising some previous favourites. This year has also seen further strengthening of the traditional weekends in Ireland and York;



the Festival of Squash, which has now become a popular annual event in November, has joined these. There are areas, however, that we still retain ambition to move forward on- they include the strengthening of the game (including doubles) outside of the South East, and overseas tours.

We were delighted that a number of our members played in the 2016 World Masters in South Africa. We congratulate all the players and especially mark the achievements of Karen Hume, Adrian Wright and Malcolm Gilham who won Gold medals. Congratulations also go to all our members who continue to excel in Regional and National Masters events.

There are, however, clouds on the

horizon. The sport that we all love is in decline, with the ability of the current England Squash organisation to move squash forward at all levels increasingly in doubt. Your Committee will continue to monitor the situation in the coming months. We have had a number of informal discussions with members of the Masters' Committee and will continue to do so. We will look to play an active role in defending and developing the Masters/Veterans game for the future.

Do please encourage new players to join. All standards are welcome and will be catered for. Please download an application form from our website and pass it on to potential members.

Your Committee is always working hard to find new blood and energy to run the GB Vets. So please volunteer if you are able to help in any way, perhaps by joining our Committee, arranging matches, tours or, indeed, in any way you are willing to contribute to the further development of our Club.

There is much to look forward to with the British Open Masters at Colets Club on 6th-11th June, the York Tour in July, the European Masters in Poland in August and the 5th Annual Festival of Squash at the RAC Woodcote Park, Epsom in early November.

Have a great summer, keep fit and continue to enjoy your squash!

MARTIN PEARSE The Masters' Master

MARTIN PEARSE founded England Squash Masters in 2004. Previously, Eric Cruttenden, a GB Vets member since 1975, had been in charge of selecting the Home International Teams, at O45 and O55 level, mainly from London players.

It was Martin who initiated the first O50 Home Internationals in 1997. As he was organiser and Captain of the GB Vets (all England players only) teams from 1996 to South Africa, it was logical for him with his contacts, to start the ball rolling.

In the last 13 years, England Squash Masters has become by far the leading Masters Group in the World.

Martin himself, has played for England every year since 1997, missing one year through injury and one through nonselection and has many records under his belt. First person to win 6 County Titles in one season, winner of the National O45 Club Championship with his beloved Leicester SRC, which his Father built in 1936. Martin played nearly 500 matches for Leicester until he left in 1982, returning occasionally to play in age group matches.

Clubs he has played for are: Leicester, Abbeydale, Kettering, Stamford, Old Wellingburians, Escorts, New Grampians, Cromer, West Norfolk, Lakenham, East Anglia, North Norfolk, Lenwade. Over 1,000 matches with an impressive win record of well over 75%. He played for Leicestershire 1st V at Senior level

over 100 times and for Norfolk at age group level exactly 102 times with 83 wins and 34 Norfolk titles, in his 26th years living at Sheringham.

His best result was the 10/9 10/9 9/0 win over Tony Martin of South Africa in the World Team O45 Final in Johannesburg in 1997 and he has won National Titles in Ireland x 2 (45), Scotland (45), Hungary (50/55), Switzerland (35), Germany x 3 (50) and European Masters 2008, European O60 in 2009 and 2

World medals, a Silver (60) and 2006 (70) and a Bronze in 2016 in Cape Town & Johannesburg. Plus 7 Regionals, District Titles and a number of Club titles.

Martin is also a formidable cricket player. He founded Seniors cricket in 2008 which has gone from strength to strength and now easily surpasses all opposition, consistently beating their main rivals, Australia. He has captained England 12 times vs Australia at 60 and 70 age groups and has many records to his name.

He has many varied interests: his company, MCP Motorsport, was the initiator for depreciation proof supercars and 98% of his stock sold over the last 20 years, has more than doubled in price.

Family wise he has been married to Jane since 1983 and has 3 children, Jack 34, Jo 33 and Laura 29, the latter being a talented portrait artist.

His memoirs, which include many hilarious sporting and non sporting escapades, are being written up as he prepares for the next chapter of his life – Masters Sport UK which is an umbrella organisation representing 40 Masters Sports,- to be turned into one large brand name for the benefit of the organisations themselves, plus, their individual members, a bit like a Sporting Saga!

Martin, having just turned 70, clearly has many years of squash and cricket left in him and we wish him good luck and fortune in his new venture. Editor.

COLIN PAYNE UPDATE

You may remember that we reported, towards the end of last year, the sudden death of Colin at the age of just 54. He had been a member since 2008, was the men's O50 National Squash Champion in 2016 and was a former Professional player on the PSA World Tour. He won the Kent Championships 5 times and represented his County on more than 100 occasions.

At the time his death was being linked to a murder inquiry. As we go to press I can report that the trial is now in progress. The Times of 10th May reported 'Boy killed stepfather with one punch during row'.

The boy is Douglas Herridge, now 18, the son of Ina Herridge who had been living with Colin since August 2014. Mr Herridge denies murder and an alternative charge of manslaughter saying he did it in self defence. The trial continues. Ed.

SQUASH REDUCES RISK OF DEATH BY 47%!

Playing squash, tennis and badminton is the best way to reduce the risk of suddenly dying, a study has found. The study, which looked at the impact of different sports on health of people found swimming cut the risk of death by 28%, aerobics by 27% and cycling by 15%.

Interestingly, it discovered that taking part in running and jogging, or football and rugby did not have a significant effect on cutting the chance of death. The study was based on 11 annual health surveys for England and Scotland from between 1994 and 2008.

The study, in the British Journal of Sports Medicine, aimed to quantify the impact of six different sports on the odds of beating death. It examined 80,306 adults over 30.
