



REGIONAL TOURNAMENTS

The first Regional Tournament was East, played in 2004 at Bury St. Edmunds, Suffolk. Following it's success the North, South and Midlands were quickly added and then latterly the West.

In 2004 England Squash Masters was formed with Martin Pearse as Organiser and Chairman and operated as an Independent section under the umbrella of England Squash and Racketball.

The Masters section now runs all 5 highly successful Regional Events each season, normally attracting up to 140 competitors from age groups - 35-75 in Men's and 35-55 in Ladies.

Each event attracts points (as do the British Open and British Closed) and at the end of the season the top four points scorers in each section (5 year age groups) are automatically selected to play for England in the annual Home Internationals. Scotland, Wales and Ireland have their own selection process.

The Masters Committee and England Squash and Racketball operate PAR (Point a Rally) scoring only in the Men's O35 and O40 age groups. All other age groups operate the traditional HiHo (Hand in Hand out) scoring.

Since their inception the Regional Events have produced over

400 winners across all age groups – this equates to nearly 120 players of which 45 are members of the Veterans Squash Club of Great Britain.

CLUB ACCOUNTS – 18 MONTHS TO 31 st DECEMBER 2012 TO BE APPROVED AT THE AGM 14th APRIL 2013

At the AGM in 2011 it was suggested that future accounting periods might end on December 31st rather than June 30th, so as to present more up-to-date accounts at the April AGMs. This proposal was subsequently accepted by your Committee. The accounts below are therefore for a unique 18-month period, to 31st December 2012, following which all future accounts will be for the calendar year. The following points may be useful when inspecting the figures.

The vast majority of our subscription income arrives by standing order on 1st

July each year, and the accounts therefore show two tranches in this respect. However, championship fees (and costs/prizes) represent just one annual tournament - due to the change in format this year we did not take our usual autumn revenue in 2012 and it will fall into spring 2013 instead.

We have made significant savings in expenditure, especially under the Handbook/ Newsletter heading, where two years' autumn expenditure (say $\pounds 5000$) has been limited to just over $\pounds 3400$ by withholding the annual handbook

update for 2012-13. Savings were made by the non-renewal of insurances, but website costs were up as we prepared for the database and members' access thereto online. The \pounds 1825 contributed to date towards our anniversary fund is shown as a balance sheet item.

The 12 months accounts to 31st December 2013 are expected to revert to normal, with no further extraneous increases or decreases as a result of the change in accounting date.

OBITUARIES



We are most saddened to learn of the death of Frank Abrahams and Brian Youngs. Jack Harris, a lifelong friend of Brian, writes as follows:

Brian Youngs died 29 November, 2012 aged 88 at his home in Kenton, Middlesex. He had played squash from the age of 39 and was a member of clubs in Eastcote and Northwood which he represented as a team player. A member of the Vets of GB from 1994, he regularly entered the tournaments. His greatest success was as winner of the over 70's in 1996 and 1997. He entered the over 80's in 2011/12 but was unable to participate through injury. However, he continued to play squash to the end albeit in the last year or so in a very leisurely format.

He had many other interests including skiing, walking and trekking. After graduating in zoology and chemistry from University College London in 1949 he became a teacher at Highbury Grammar School in North London. Thereafter, he studied naturopathy and osteopathy and became a professional osteopath in the 1950s. He continued in practice for the rest of his life and was much respected in the profession becoming President of the BNOA from 1964 to 1966.

He was very happily married to his childhood sweetheart, Anne, who died in 2004. They had five sons, one sadly dying whilst a baby. Brian was a man of considerable intellect and character and the most delightful company. Always courteous and friendly with a great sense of humour and endearing roar of laughter. He is much missed by his many friends gathered over his long life.
