However, whilst Stuart and I, together with our Committee members, look forward to the time when we are back on the squash courts, our thoughts at the moment are with our members and their extended families. We wish you all a safe emergence from these difficult times.

It is with great sadness we announce that Jim Dougal passed away peacefully on 27th February 2020. Jim, who was a member of the GB Vets since 2011, was a tenacious match player with great touch and deception and confident of his own ability.

He was successful at Regional, National and International level – he won numerous Scottish Regional titles and won a total of five National titles at O55, O60 and O65. He won a silver medal in the European Championships in 2017.

His biggest success was winning the British Masters Open O65 title in 2016 where he beat John Rae in the final. Jim represented Scotland at the Home Internationals with great success from 2007 and captained the team which won the O65 title in 2016.

Jim will be greatly missed by all who knew him – another sad time for our squash family.

GB VETS VS FITZWILLIAM – 21 FEBRUARY 2020

The annual match versus Fitzwilliam club was played to coincide with the England Ireland Rugby game weekend, which our visitors had fortunately secured tickets for on the Sunday 23rd February. This year, for the squash match we were able to secure courts at Lords Cricket Ground, facilitated by one of our players, **Gordon Kerr**, who is a member. Gordon was also able to secure a tour round the facilities, to the delight of our guests, who found themselves exploring the hallowed halls of the Long Room, the visitors dressing room and gazing at the ground from the players balcony.

The match itself proved a very close affair with all the strings closely contested. At string 4 Gordon kicked off in a tightly fought duel edging 2:1 in the lead only to run out of steam as his opponent clinched the game 3:2. On the other court No. 3 **Peter Culver** was involved in another tight duel, moving well after his recent hip operation. So well in fact that he took the match 3:1. Next on court was No 1 **Steve Johnson**, fresh from his British Open triumph, if not a little battered and bruised from his labours! Playing a talented much younger opponent Steve lost the first two very tight games, but in pulling one back ran out of

steam to go down 3:1. However over on the other court things looked more hopeful as **Tammy Bennett** playing her old rival Fitz Captain Michael Roden. Having lost some close recent encounters to him in previous matches things did not look good as she easily lost the first. However, rallying she played some great squash and ran out a 3:1 winner. So match level. Could the final 2 pull off victory. **Kim Ricks**

playing at 5 had a formidable opponent in the Irish Attorney General (AG). Could he bring his legal skills to bear on court or would Kim undermine his defence. The match was nip and tuck the whole way and with Kim standing at 9/6 in the fifth things looked good. However with some great shots and fair degree of luck with the frame of the racket the AG scraped home 12:10. Playing last could Captain **Steve Jackson** at least level the match. Playing a much younger opponent whom he had beaten 10/9 in the fifth in a previous match, he was always going to be up against it. With never more than a couple of points in it Steve looked like he would even the match at 9/6 in the fourth but his opponent had other ideas and with skill and a touch of luck squeezed home 13/11 to seal the game 3:1 and the match 4:2 to Fitzwilliam.

The dinner was held in the beautiful setting of Queens Club and we were joined by other Fitz teams who were playing the Jesters and Public School Old Boys. Some 40 people enjoyed dinner and some amusing speeches from the respective Captains.
